



# Quick Guide to...

## Fellow (RICS Accelerated Route)

Fellows will have significant senior experience as a civil engineering surveyor and will have demonstrated a contribution to the industry that is over and above their everyday professional work.






### Eligibility

Using this route a Fellow will:

-  Be a Fellow of the Royal Institution of Chartered Surveyors.
-  Be able to demonstrate significant experience in the civil engineering or geospatial environment.

### How to Apply

A Fellow application via the RICS Accelerated Route must include:

-  Online application form with details of 2 sponsors (fellows of RICS, ICES, Institution of Civil Engineers or Chartered Institute of Building).
-  Evidence of being a Fellow of the RICS and payment of annual subscription in the current year.
-  A detailed CV.
-  Digital photograph.
-  The fee of £75.00.

### Detailed CV

The detailed CV is an opportunity to demonstrate your knowledge, understanding, range of skills, technical competencies (as defined by ICES) and experience on the basis of a whole career description. It should be written specifically to support your application. The CV should include colleges and universities attended, qualifications gained, as well as details of work experience. This should include any periods not in employment or employed in non or semi-related fields. The CV should demonstrate experience in the civil engineering industry in either the commercial or geospatial environment by providing brief details of the relevant projects you have contributed to. The detailed CV for applications via this route should be approximately 2,000 words long.
